IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

The Immunization Regulations from the Pennsylvania Department of Health and Pennsylvania School Code currently in effect for school attendance are as follows:

<u>Every student in all grades attending school in Pennsylvania must have the following</u> Immunizations:

(Those in **BOLD** print indicate new requirements that went into effect in 2017).

- 4 doses tetanus, diphtheria, & pertussis (DTaP)
 - o 4th dose on or after 4th birthday
- 4 doses polio
 - o 4th dose on or after 4th birthday & at least 6 months after previous dose
- 2 doses measles, mumps, & rubella (MMR)
 - o both doses on or after age 1
- 3 doses hepatitis B (Hep B)
 - last dose given after 6 months of age
- 2 doses of varicella (chickenpox)
 - o both doses on or after age 1
 - o or evidence of having a chickenpox infection documented with a note from the doctor.

In addition, students attending 7th through 12th grade need the following:

- 1 dose of Tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis (TDaP)
 - o required to enter 7th grade (or to enter grade 8-12 if missed in 7th grade)
- 2 doses of meningococcal vaccine (MCV)
 - o 1st dose required to enter 7th grade
 - Dose must be given between the age of 11-15
 - o 2[™] dose required to enter 12[™] grade
 - 2nd dose must be given at on or after age 16.

Please review your child's immunizations with your healthcare provider to ensure that all requirements have been met. All required immunizations are due by the first day of school. Failure to comply with this state regulation will result in exclusion on September 4, 2018.
